
The hall was tight and noisy for 30 plus, but we had a kitchen and serving bar area with a large covered deck in the back. There was great food and fun for everyone.

We started Thursday evening with Happy Hour, then everyone was on their on for dinner. Later we met for Left, Center, Right.







Originally known as Mount Airy and then Snow Hill, in 1905 it became known as Chinsegut Hill; where owners Colonel Raymond and Margaret Robins hosted many notable dignitaries of the early twentieth century.
